Let's go visit Tonori no Anyado

Take a stroll around the port!



Follow the path until you come to the sign that says (海星堂約 500m) and continue in that direction. Go through the Bamboo covered walkway, across the bridge and continue onwards for approximately 15 minutes for Tonori no Anyado. Beside the hall, there's a sacred area called Yashiro-sama that consists of 33 stone monuments. Each stone has a different blessing, such as the 6th "lliyama-kan-non" that helps the lonely find love or the 12th "Jion-ji", which brings the weary traveler good fortune. Residents still on a regular basis demonstrate their piety at this location.



8 Local History Museum

Sarutahiko-Ohkami Deity and the Shinto ritual, Niju-gó nichi sama

Sarutahiko-Ohkami is a deity that drives away unusual diseases and curses of ill health. He is to be found at forked roads throughout the village, and so he forms an integral part of the islander's life. Every year on the 25th January according to the lunar calendar, a god from the sea comes ashore. A Shinto priest will then escort this god to each of the Sarutahiko-Ohkami stones for prayers. This ritual is called 'Nijurgo nichi sama''. See if you can spot him as you stroll around the village.


Wheat-based Shochu "Moriwaka"
